





Homeless Information Line (HIL)


Created to assist people who are experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of becoming homeless, received **755** calls from **259** unique callers.


Homeless Information Line (HIL)

The HIL is operated M - F; 2 - 5 pm


BRACH has received funding from HOPS to expand the HIL hours to 9-5; M-F and will be housed at The Haven in FY24


Organization Overview

- Low-barrier overnight emergency shelter for adults during coldest months *PLUS* specialized housing programs for women and seniors
- Mobilize 80+ faith congregations and hundreds of volunteers, in partnership with the broader community of organizations serving




