Fire Service

- 1. Pharmacy Tech Mandate (Additional FTE)
- 2. Plans Reviewer Capacity (Shift from Returning Retiree to FTE)
- 3. Equipment Replacement (Addition of \$4M over next 5 years)



Police

- 1. Equipment Costs (Increase resulting from full capacity)
- 2. Take Home Car Program (Increase costs)
- 3. Operating Increases



Emergency Management

- 1. Readiness Investments
- 2. Equipment Investments



Transportation

Planning

- CARTA (Charlottesville-Albemarle Regional Transit Authority)
- Implementation of Battery Electric School Buses

- Request for Additional Drivers, Mechanics, and HR Support (\$2.9M)
